The presentation today is on wild giant cave cockroach, *Blaberus giganteus*, of Livingston area and Peten. In the mountains of Izabal we have experienced these actual insects flying into the dining room while we were having dinner (in a camp site, no walls on the camp buildings). It is frankly wonderful to have seen these giant cockroaches up-close and in-person.



This insect has the most detail, on the head and body. I estimate that all are giant cave cockroaches but there could be others.



As most Maya insects, there are "arms and legs" like a human not six like an actual insect.
